Adult refers to Riders 18 years old and older.

Adult Professional means a rider who no longer is a Junior but does accept sponsorship or monetary gains from his/her riding.

No Rider protections are available unless ShowPlus™ benefits are available for the horse. See Benefit Schedule for Horses.

A rider's protections are contingent upon riding a horse registered to compete in at least one class that week and last for the duration of the rider's competition(s) that week.

*Consequential reimbursements for diagnostics and stitching are available when the rider is not eligible for other parameters. In the event, the rider is eligible for reimbursement for alternate parameters, the reimbursement limit for diagnostics and stitching is included in the alternate parameter limit.

All incidents must be reported on the showplus.com website as soon as possible, preferably within 48 hours and no later than seven (7) days after their occurrence. All requests will be denied if not submitted within seven days from the date of the incident.

BENEFIT SCHEDULE FOR HORSES

MORTALITY	\$100,000
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Maximum potential mortality payment, supplemental to any existing mortality policy, but not to exceed the actual amount of the loss.

URGENT VETERINARIAN CARE

\$10,000

Maximum urgent veterinarian care for each horse, with a scale based on the type of injury or illness.

CONSEQUENTIAL LOSS

Up to \$2,500

Protections under ShowPlus™ are provided on a weekly basis.

Protections expire at the end of each week for horses stabled on site.

For the FEI jog, coverage is available two hours before the jog is scheduled to begin and only when the animal is on the Showgrounds.

For horses stabled off-site, protections are triggered at 12:01 AM on the day of class and expire at 11:59 PM after the horse finishes competing that day and are reinstated for each day the horse competes in the same week.

A trailer-in benefit is available for animals stabled more than 11 miles from the showgrounds. Protections begin 2 hours before the class the horse is entered in starts and ends 2 hours after the class is finished and is limited to only when the animal is on the showgrounds.

*If it's determined the issue was pre-existing or chronic, benefits are limited to 30%.

No benefits:

*at all are afforded on Mondays, or "dark days."

*for accidents or injuries in paddock or due to turnout.

*as the result of failure to provide appropriate care or neglect of any animal.

*if the incident is not reported per the instructions on the website.

*for treatments normally associated with the maintenance of a healthy animal.

*for pre-existing or chronic conditions other than for bone scans, MRI, or CT Scan, which are subject to limitations.

*for experimental or voluntary surgery or procedure of any type.

*for any medical treatment or disease control measures associated with any communicable/contagious disease outbreak.

*for any animal that is the subject of a late (same day) registration.

*if any animal both scheduled to, and competing at least once for 4 consecutive weeks; coverage reinstated after a 7 day rest.

*for any horse younger than 4 years old and older than 18 years old unless the event is sanctioned by the FEI.

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
